### Project Final Results

The EduNUT project successfully developed a range of innovative educational materials, including:

- ✓ **The EduNUT Good practices and Case Studies datasets** - providing educators with inspiration and practical tools to integrate food sustainability into their teaching.
- ✓ **A Massive Open Online Course (MOOC)** - ensuring free and long-term access to high-quality training on food literacy and sustainability education.

✓ **The EduNUT Lexicon** - designed to provide clear insights into various aspects of the food industry, from production to final consumption.

✓ **The EduNUT Curriculum** - to help students build knowledge, skills, and attitudes to adopt sustainable habits, inspire others, and become future changemakers in food systems.

✓ **The EduNUT Board Game** - a fun, interactive way to engage students in discussions about sustainable food systems.

These resources remain accessible via the EduNUT website and open educational platforms, ensuring the project's impact extends beyond its official duration.

### Final Online Conference

On **January 30, 2025**, EduNUT partners and stakeholders came together for the **Final Online Conference**, marking the project's successful completion.



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With **73 participants** from different countries, the event served as a platform to reflect on project outcomes and explore future applications of EduNUT's results. The conference featured insightful presentations, including:
